The Business

Development Board's chief mission is to attract and retain business

investment and high quality jobs in Palm Beach County through corporate relocations, expansions and international trade. To fulfill that mission, the BDB aggressively markets the county and its opportunities at a variety of venues not just in the United States, but also abroad.

In April the BDB led a delegation of ambassadors from Palm Beach County to BIO 2006, the world's largest biotechnology gathering. During the multi-day event, the BDB met with leading biotechnology executives, venture capitalists, journalists, policy makers and scientists to promote Palm Beach County and the state's unique and cutting-edge biotechnology business climate. BIO 2006 was an important opportunity to meet with the world's brightest life scientists and researchers, as well as visionary entrepreneurs and investors, which is very much in line with the BDB's efforts to promote Palm Beach County's life sciences cluster.

June 6-8 the BDB will be a part of the Florida delegation to the Medical Design and Manufacturing Exposition and Conference (MD&M) in New York City. In 2004, \$98 billion worth of medical products were designed and

manufactured in the United States. Over the past decade, medical device manufacturers averaged 23 percent annual growth at profit levels which are the envy of every other manufacturing sector. With medical device companies such as Disc Motion Technologies, The Anspach Companies, and 3i, Palm Beach County is home to a growing and prosperous medical device community.

In July the BDB will travel to the United Kingdom with Enterprise Florida and Governor Jeb Bush to market the county's life science and aerospace/aviation industries. During July 15-21, a representative from the BDB will travel to the Farnborough International Air Show to promote the county to the aerospace/aviation industry. While in the U.K., the BDB's representative also will tour the University of Oxford and meet with life science companies.

The Business Development Board is committed to providing diverse economic development opportunities for our members. By presenting information about Palm Beach County at domestic and international venues, the BDB cultivates leads and works with prospects that ultimately will contribute to the county's economy - and benefit our member's bottom line.

BDB UPDATE

Dear BDB Member,

October 1, 2005 through March 31, 2006 was a very productive time for the Business Development Board. During that time -- the first half of our fiscal year -- we accomplished the following:

- Facilitated 12 relocation, expansion and retention projects that added/retained 951 high-quality, high-paying jobs to Palm Beach County's economy.
- Developed a solid pipeline of prospects considering Palm Beach County. These
 projects could create an additional 550 jobs when announced and closed. Thirty
 percent of these companies come from the life science industry.
- Assisted a variety of businesses through county and state incentive application
 processes to offset expenses associated with relocating or expanding. Our projects
 were successfully approved for \$2 million.
- Served as the lead agency in Palm Beach County to organize and facilitate the state's emergency bridge loan program to small companies who experienced physical damage from Hurricane Wilma. Through the leadership of several local banks, 94 companies received a total of \$2.1 million.
- Hosted an average of five member events per month including cluster meetings, orientations, upper level breakfast meetings, Coffee Talk with the President and business seminars to provide increased opportunities for members to network and grow their businesses.
- Created a new Business Resource Task Force that meets every eight weeks to develop programs that will increase business opportunities for BDB members.
- Created a new Bioscience Incentive Task Force led by Frank Compiani of RSM McGladrey. This committee conducted a full review of bioscience incentives offered throughout the country.
- Ongoing involvement in a variety of special issue task forces and initiatives including the Housing Leadership Council, Glades Economic Alliance, Palm Beach County Economic Summit, QE3 and a variety of South Florida regional economic development initiatives.
- Increased communications with the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners. Each commissioner now has a business designee on the BDB Board in addition to the Chairman, Commissioner Tony Masilotti.
- Assisted two Palm Beach County companies in accessing the Space Alliance Technology Outreach Program which provides 40 hours of free engineering assistance for product development.
- Produced and placed print ads in national media outlets and created new print and video material for use at BIO 2006.

PROCACCI BREAKS GROUND WITH CLASS "A" OFFICE SPACE

HURRICANE RESISTANT TO 185 MILES PER HOUR

Not only is South Florida an ideal climate with its sunshine and warm weather, but the Palm Beach County office market has continued to tighten over the past 24 months, as vacancy rates in downtown are reportedly reaching single digits. The West Palm Beach office submarket has not seen significant new construction in nearly five years, helping to propel its already low vacancy rates even further. As a result, West Palm Beach has become a thriving corporate environment ready to welcome the onset of new construction.



Procacci Development Corporation is pleased to announce the first wave of new construction in West Palm Beach with the groundbreaking of Emerald View at Vista Center located just west of Florida's Turnpike on Okeechobee Boulevard. Emerald View at Vista Center will offer 180,000 square feet of class "A" hurricane-resistant office space.

Innovative in design, each of these buildings will be constructed as hurricane resistant, able to withstand winds up to 185 miles per hour (a category five hurricane). Each building will place its HVAC equipment and 20,000-gallon diesel-engine generator in its own hurricane-resistant structure. The generator will provide power for up to 14 days in the event of a power loss, enabling companies to continue vital operations without suffering a major time deficit.

As forecasts point to increased intensity of hurricanes this season and over the next few decades, can you or your clients afford business downtime?

Phase I of the Emerald View at Vista Center project is well underway with the foundation, elevator shafts and stair towers in place as of last month. The tilting of the walls was completed as of April 1. The two 70,000-square-foot buildings are being constructed simultaneously and will feature four stories each with 17,500-square-foot floor plates and suites available from 1,000 square feet. Phase II will offer a 40,000-square-foot building with three stories of approximately 13,000-square-foot floor plates on a parcel located across Vista Parkway and adjacent to the new Palm Beach County Government Building, Planning and Zoning Department facility.


Emerald View at Vista Center will have vast free surface parking at the rate of 4.4 per 1,000 square feet, affording employees and clients freedom from downtown garages with expensive and limited parking options. Not only will parking provide a significant savings to individuals and businesses alike, but the location of Emerald View at Vista Center will provide more convenient accessibility to the office given its close proximity to downtown and the major thoroughfares of the county.

The 2005 hurricane season set a record with 26 named storms causing significant damage. While Katrina and Rita were especially unkind to the Gulf States, Wilma wreaked the most havoc on South Florida. On Oct. 24, 2005, Hurricane Wilma knocked out power for weeks, damaged thousands of homes and businesses, and left commercial and residential buildings with punched windows, shredded roofs and extensive damage in general. As most traffic signals were lost and power lines downed, businesses were forced to close their doors for weeks. Small firms and large corporations were affected, with some businesses able to reopen their doors only to announce layoffs later to make up

for lost earnings. Other large corporations combined work forces with satellite offices in the area to reduce losses. Yet a number of businesses were never able to reopen their doors for business due to the widespread power outages and damage sustained from this devastating storm. The common thread among businesses of all sizes: Downtime is a lethal ingredient to a successful business.

The official start of the 2006 hurricane season is June 1. This season's forecast calls for 17 named tropical storms, nine hurricanes and five major hurricanes with winds exceeding 110 miles per hour. There is an 81 percent chance that at least one major hurricane will hit the U.S. coast this season.
